

Janet Hill is a Professor & Head of the Department of Veterinary Microbiology at the University of Saskatchewan, co-Editor-in-Chief of *ISME Communications*, and a past President of the Canadian Society of Microbiologists. She was born in Toronto. Dr. Hill received her B.Sc.H. in Biology and Ph.D. in Microbiology at Queen's University at Kingston, followed by postdoctoral training at the University of Illinois and the National Research Council. Her graduate and postdoctoral studies included insect and plant virology, human parasitology, molecular diagnostics and bioinformatics. Dr. Hill's research interests are in microbial diversity and ecology, and the role of complex microbial communities in animal and human health. She is a developer of DNA barcoding approaches based on the universal *cpn60* gene and her lab is the home of *cpnDB*, a public database of chaperonin sequences. Dr. Hill is an enthusiastic teacher and research mentor of undergraduate and graduate students. When she isn't in the lab, she is usually watching and photographing birds.
