Update to CAW on Solar Power System – Kangela Community Health Center

We are please to report that the building of a solar power grid at the Kangela Community Health Center has



gone very well. The solar panels supply energy to the building that has maternal and child health care, delivery support, vaccinations, general hospital beds with fixed lighting for each room. It also supplies the electrical power for refrigeration of medicines and vaccines.



This is the refrigeration unit. It has made a great difference in the preservation of needed vaccines and drugs.





This is the conversion unit to turn the solar energy into electricity.
